Note: Unless otherwise specified, you will be randomly scheduled to test on one of the dates indicated above.

This Notice of Examination was amended on November 2, 2022 to change the date on which testing is expected to begin from September 17, 2022 to October 15, 2022.

## JOB DESCRIPTION

**Dispatchers (Rapid Transit Operations)**, under general supervision, have immediate responsibility for the movement of MTA New York City Transit trains in passenger and work service in an assigned sector of the train way; into, out of, and within terminal stations and yards, through gap stations and within the yard, such as: to and from lay-up tracks, car wash facilities, inspection barns, repair and overhaul shops utilizing manual and computerized systems. They oversee the general train makeup, including the coupling and uncoupling of train cars; ensure that subordinates and other employees are properly equipped and fit for duty; handle emergencies, unusual occurrences and investigate accidents; study traffic conditions along the train-way and within the confines of a yard facility to ensure adequacy of services; make reports and keep manual and computerized records of all train movements; make station announcements and perform related work.

Some of the physical activities performed by Dispatchers (Rapid Transit Operations) and environmental conditions experienced are: descending onto and climbing off tracks; following the movement of color-coded lights; communicating by radio; climbing steep stairways and walking along catwalks or narrow passageways; and hearing train horns and other sound signals.

**Special Working Conditions**: Dispatchers (Rapid Transit Operations) may be required to work various shifts, including nights, Saturdays, Sundays and holidays.

(This brief description does not include all of the duties of this position.)

# **SALARY**

The current minimum salary for Dispatcher (Rapid Transit Operations) is \$78,355 per annum increasing to \$97,944 per annum in the sixth year of service. These rates are subject to change.

# **ELIGIBILITY TO TAKE EXAMINATION**

This examination is open to each employee of MTA New York City Transit who **on the first date of the multiple-choice test**:

- 1. Is permanently (not provisionally) employed in or appears on a Preferred List (see Note, below) for the eligible title of Assistant Train Dispatcher, Train Operator, or Tower Operator; and
- 2. has been permanently employed in such title or titles in MTA New York City Transit for not less than one year; and
- 3. Is not otherwise ineligible.

(Note: A "Preferred List" is a civil service list which is only for certain former permanent incumbents of the eligible title who have rehiring rights.)

This examination is also open to employees who were appointed to an eligible title pursuant to New York State Civil Service Law, section 55-a, and who meet all other eligibility requirements.

You are responsible for determining whether you meet the eligibility requirements for this examination prior to submitting the Application. If you do not know if you are eligible, check with **your department's Human Resources representative**. You may be given the test before we verify your eligibility. If you are marked "Not Eligible," your application fee will **not** be refunded, and you will **not** receive a score.

This examination is <u>not</u> open to employees of MaBSTOA or MTA Bus Company, or to employees of MTA agencies other than MTA New York City Transit.

## REQUIREMENTS TO BE PROMOTED

**Probationary Period:** At the time of promotion, you must have completed your probationary period in the eligible title as indicated in the above "Eligibility to Take Examination" section, and you must be permanently employed in that title or your name must appear on a Preferred List for the title at the time of promotion. Additionally, you must have served permanently in the eligible title for at least one year. Time served prior to a break in service of more than one year will not be credited.

**Drug Screening Requirement:** You must pass a drug screening in order to be promoted, and if promoted, you will be subject to random drug and alcohol tests for the duration of your employment. Additionally, if you have tested positive on a drug or alcohol test or had a refusal to test during preemployment or while employed by a Federal DOT-regulated employer during the applicable period, you must have completed the Substance Abuse Professional (SAP) evaluation, referral and education/treatment process required by federal law in order to be promoted to this safety-sensitive position.

# **HOW TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION**

If you believe you meet the requirements in the "Eligibility to Take Examination" section, you may submit an application during the application period. The MTA Exam Information Center, located in the lobby of 180 Livingston Street, Brooklyn, NY 11201, is <u>currently closed</u>. If you believe you have a special circumstance (e.g., a disability, military duty) that prevents you from applying as instructed below, please refer to the Special Circumstances Guide referenced in the "Special Arrangements" section below. Applications will <u>not</u> be accepted in person.

# **Online Applications:**

1. If you are an active MTA employee, apply using the "BSC" employee portal at <a href="www.mymta.info">www.mymta.info</a> by the last day of the application period (non-active MTA employees and applicants requesting a fee waiver must email us by the last day of the application period at <a href="examsunit@nyct.com">examsunit@nyct.com</a> for application instructions). <a href="Note">Note</a>: The application system may not function properly with mobile devices or tablets. For best results when applying, please use the latest version of Internet Explorer, open a new window, and avoid having multiple tabs open in the same window.

# **HOW TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION**

- 2. Once you have logged in, click on the My Job Search ribbon and then click on Exams (non-Railroad).
- 3. Follow the steps to submit an application.
- 4. Active MTA employees must pay the application fee via payroll deduction.
- 5. A confirmation number will appear on the same page after submitting your application and authorizing a payroll deduction (Save this number for future reference).

**IMPORTANT**: Your application submission confirms that you have read this Notice of Examination, including any dates and the requirements.

**Application Fee**: This fee is generally not refundable. Under special circumstances, you may be entitled to a refund. Please refer to the Department of Citywide Administrative Services ("DCAS") General Exam Regulation E.3.4 to determine if you are entitled to a refund. #### **ADMISSION LETTER**

An Admission Letter will be mailed to you about 10 days before the first date of the multiple-choice test. If you do not receive an Admission Letter at least 4 days before this date, you must email a request for a duplicate Admission Letter to <a href="mailto:examsunit@nyct.com">examsunit@nyct.com</a>. A paper copy of the Admission Letter is your ticket for admission to the test.

Applicants **must** keep their mailing address **up to date**. Please refer to the "Correspondence" section below for instructions on how to update your address and other contact information.

#### THE TEST

You will be given a multiple-choice test. A score of at least 70% is required to pass the multiple-choice test.

You will be scheduled to take the test on one of the dates listed in the above "Test Date" box. You will be assigned to a test date and location, and you cannot request that your scheduled test date or location be changed, unless you meet the conditions in the "Special Arrangements" section below.

Your score on the multiple-choice test will determine 85% of your final score. Your seniority will determine the remaining 15%. You must pass the multiple-choice test to have your seniority credited. Your seniority score will be 70 plus ½ point for each three months of completed, continuous, permanent service with an agency under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner, Department of Citywide Administrative Services, in competitive class titles. Your service will be credited through the first date of the multiple-choice test, up to a maximum of 15 years. Time served prior to a break in service of more than one year will not be credited.

# THE TEST (Continued)

Veterans' or Disabled Veterans' Credit will be granted only to eligible passing candidates who request that they be applied. Veterans' or Disabled Veterans' Credit should be requested at the time of application but **must** be requested before the date the eligible list is established. Claims for Veterans' or Disabled Veterans' Credit cannot be made once the eligible list is established.

The multiple-choice test may include questions on:

- Rules and Regulations: Knowledge of rules and regulations that govern train movement throughout the system
  - o Example: Recalling the reverse train procedure to use in an emergency situation
- Interpreting schedules: Reviewing, interpreting and understanding train schedules
  - o Example: Reading and understanding the train schedule for the 10 line
- Mathematical Reasoning: Making job-related arithmetic calculations
  - o Example: Calculating the distance between two stations using track markers
- Railroad Equipment: Knowledge of railroad equipment such as car and track equipment and tower switching machines
  - Example: Selecting the correct switch operator to switch a train to the local track at a location
- Railroad terminology: Knowledge of railroad terminology
  - Example: Utilizing the transit radio codes over the radio to conductors and train operators
- **Forms and Records:** Knowledge of forms and records commonly used by Dispatchers (Rapid Transit Operations), when to use them and how to complete them
  - Example: Completing a G-2 based on an incident you observed on the tracks
- Supervisory Rules and Regulations: Knowledge of supervisory rules and regulations; emergency procedures; communication methods
  - Example: Informing subordinates of workplace policies regarding time-off request
- Safety: Knowledge of safe practices and procedures
  - Example: Using an approved tool bag without a shoulder strap while walking on the tracks

The test may also include questions on other related abilities or knowledge areas.

# **TEST ADMINISTRATION GUIDELINES**

**Warning:** You are not permitted to enter the test site with cellular phones, smart watches, beepers, pagers, cameras, portable media players, or other electronic devices. Calculators are permitted; however, they must be hand-held, battery or solar powered, numeric only. Calculators with functions **other than** addition, subtraction, multiplication and division **are prohibited**. Electronic devices with an alphabetic keyboard or with word processing or data recording capabilities such as planners, organizers, etc. are prohibited. If you use any of these devices in the building at any time before, during or after the test, you may **not** receive your test results, your test score may be nullified, and your application fee will **not** be refunded.

**Social Distancing** and other safety protocols, **including the wearing of masks**, will be required during the administration of the test. Further details will be provided on your admission letter.

You may not have any other person, including children, present with you while you are being processed for or taking the test and no one may wait for you inside of the test site while you are taking the test.

Leaving: You must leave the test site once you finish the test. If you leave the test site after being fingerprinted but before finishing the test, you will not be permitted to re-enter. If you disregard this

instruction and re-enter the test site, you may not receive your test results, your test score may be nullified, and your application fee will not be refunded.

**Proof of Identity:** You must present your MTA New York City Transit employee ID when you arrive to take the test.

# THE TEST RESULTS

If you pass the multiple-choice test and are marked eligible, your name will be placed in final score order on an eligible list and you will be given a list number. You will be notified by mail of your test results. If you meet all requirements and conditions, you will be considered for promotion when your name is reached on the eligible list.

# ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

**Training:** You may be required to undergo a formalized training course during your probationary period. Failure to successfully complete the training course may result in termination or a return to your previously held permanent title.

## SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS

**Late Applications**: Refer to the "Correspondence" section below to contact the Examinations Unit to determine the procedure for submitting a late application if you meet one of the following conditions:

- 1. You are absent from work for at least one-half of the application period and are unable to apply for reasons such as vacation, sick leave or military duty; or
- 2. You become eligible after the above application period, but before the first test date.

**Special Test Accommodations:** If you plan to request an alternate test date due to your religious observance or special testing accommodations due to disability, please follow the instructions included in the Special Circumstances Guide, which is accessible online at <a href="http://web.mta.info/nyct/hr/forms\_instructions.htm">http://web.mta.info/nyct/hr/forms\_instructions.htm</a> and will be attached to this Notice of Examination during the application period. An alternate test date due to religious observance must be requested no later than 15 days prior to the date on which multiple-choice testing is expected to begin. Special testing accommodations due to disability must be requested no later than 30 days prior to the date on which multiple-choice testing is expected to begin.

**Make-Up Tests:** You may apply for a make-up test if you cannot take the multiple-choice test as scheduled for any of the following reasons:

- 1. Compulsory attendance before a public body; or
- 2. On-the-job injury or illness caused by municipal employment where you are an officer or employee of the City; or
- 3. Absence from the test within one week after the death of a spouse, domestic partner, parent, sibling, child, or child of a domestic partner where you are an officer or employee of the City; or
- 4. Absence due to ordered military duty; or
- 5. A clear error for which MTA New York City Transit is responsible; or
- 6. A temporary disability, pregnancy-related, or child-birth related condition preventing you from taking the test.

## **CORRESPONDENCE**
