Beaches

From Long Beach to Fire Island, you can amble along boardwalks, pitch a tent next to the ocean, or simply lay back and soak up the sun. And the LIRR will get you there quickly and easily.

- Long Beach Long Beach Station (Long Beach Branch): This historic seaside destination boasts an iconic boardwalk, some of the best surfing on the island, excellent restaurants and bars, and a large public beach just a short walk from the LIRR station.
- Jones Beach **Freeport Station** (Babylon Branch with connection to the N88 NICE Bus):

Over six miles of public beach await you at Jones Beach, plus the WildPlay Adventure Park and the Northwell at Jones Beach Theater, home to several summer concerts.

 Robert Moses State Park – Babylon Station (Babylon Branch with connection to Suffolk County Transit Bus Line 15): Surfing and surf-fishing are highlights here, as well as five miles of beach, an 18-hole pitch-andputt golf course, the historic Fire Island Lighthouse, and the towns of Kismet and Saltaire.

#### Fire Island – Montauk Branch:

Whether you're taking in the LGBTQfriendly nightlife in Cherry Grove and The Pines, camping at Watch Hill, admiring nature in the Sunken Forest, or playing in the surf and sand with your family at Kismet Beach, Davis Park, or Ocean Beach, Fire Island has something for everyone. To get from an LIRR station to the ferry terminal, you can walk, take a taxi, or use a rideshare service.

- Sayville Station (Sayville Ferry) for Cherry Grove, The Pines, and Sunken Forest
- **Bay Shore Station** (Fire Island Ferries) for Ocean Beach, Ocean Bay Park, and Kismet
- Patchogue Station (Davis Park Ferry) for Davis Park and Watch Hill

**UBS Arena** – Elmont Station: The home of the New York Islanders, UBS Arena is one of New York's premier live entertainment and sports venues. See ubsarena.com for a full lineup of events.

**Forest Hills Stadium –** Forest Hills Station: This historic outdoor music venue has welcomed fans to the picturesque neighborhood of Forest Hills, Queens for over 100 years. See foresthillsstadium.com for a full lineup of shows.

#### Northwell at Jones Beach Theater -

Freeport Station (Babylon Branch and connect to N88 Nice Bus): Jones Beach Theater is an outdoor seasonal concert amphitheater with stunning water views.

Ryder Cup – Free shuttle service will be provided to/ from Farmingdale Station (Ronkonkoma Branch): The 2025 Ryder Cup will be held at the Black Course at Bethpage State Park in Farmingdale, September 23-28.

**Oyster Festival** – Oyster Bay Station (Oyster Bay Branch): The region's largest waterfront festival, OysterFest takes place at a historic hamlet just steps away from the LIRR station, October 18-19.

# **Montauk Branch**

The first lighthouse to be built in New York, the Montauk Lighthouse is also known as "The End." Stops along the way include connections to the region's best beaches, Fire Island, and the Hamptons.

#### **Greenport Branch**

Walk to the picturesque Greenport Village or the Railroad Museum or take a quick rideshare to your favorite vineyard or orchard. Stops along the way include the Long Island Aquarium (Riverhead Station) or Tanger Outlets (Deer Park).

#### **Port Washington Branch**

The upscale waterfront town of Port Washington offers a fun escape, just steps away from the LIRR station. Don't miss Port Promenade, an exciting happy-hour street festival with live music, outdoor dining, and an unbeatable atmosphere on June 12 and July 17 from 5-10 p.m.

## **Port Jefferson Branch**

Port Jefferson is quaint and walkable — a summertime hidden treasure. You'll find waterfront dining, charming ice cream shoppes, art galleries, specialty shops, and much more. Experience the small-town charm and waterfront serenity of Northport, a perfect place to relax and unwind.

Just a 10-minute walk from the Bay Shore Station, Alive by the Bay is a car-free street festival that transforms Main Street into a lively summer hotspot. Take the train and join the fun on July 1, July 15, July 29, and August 12, from 5-9 p.m.

# **Ronkonkoma Branch**

Farmingdale has a vibrant and walkable downtown known for its diverse culinary scene, charming boutiques, and lively entertainment options. Be sure to check out Music on Main, the town's summer festival series of outdoor music and dining, taking place July 10, July 24, August 7, and August 21, 5-9 p.m.

Greenport is a relaxed, historic coastal community with endless hidden treasures. Enjoy waterfront dining, antique shopping, and a ride on the town's 100-year-old wooden carousel.

# **Babylon Branch**

Known for its restaurants, shops, and nightlife, Babylon is also home to attractions like the Argyle Theatre and picturesque Argyle Lake Park.

Enjoy fresh seafood, lively vibes, and beautiful waterfront views in Freeport, just a short rideshare away from the train station.
