## Sewer Line Work Continues Along Second Avenue



New sewer lines are being installed along Second Avenue between 106 and 109 Street. Work will begin in front of the Tito Puente Education Complex in the coming weeks. The outreach team has been working closely with school administrators to ensure a smooth process for school bus pick-up and drop-offs. The work will last several months and be coordinated with the schools until completion.



Working with the school administration at District 75 the Second Avenue Subway community outreach team was able to maintain the busing pick-up and drop-off area on Second Avenue and 108 Street to lessen the impact of the construction work taking place outside the Tito Puente Education Complex. The buses will be able to stop at the rear of the school on 108 Street allowing students to enter the building as they normally would.



Utility relocation crews working at 110 Street and Second Avenue are installing new concrete conduits used to connect electrical utilities to the new manholes. Once the conduits are installed work crews will then pull new electrical cables from manhole to manhole along the Phase 2 subway construction corridor. This type of work will occur throughout the work area between 104 and 112 Street.

# Community Engagement



The Second Avenue Subway community outreach team joined State Senator Cordell Cleare at a Summer Stage event that was held at the Adam Clayton Powell, Jr. Plaza in Harlem. The outreach team shared information with event attendees about upcoming Phase 2 construction. Senator Cleare holds the event regularly during the summer months.



The Second Avenue Subway project team met with members of the 125<sup>th</sup> Street Business Improvement District (BID). The meeting was part of our outreach initiative to provide business owners with the most up to date information about the project and the upcoming construction work along the commercial corridor.

Most of the work on 125 Street will occur underground via the use of a tunnel boring machine, which will lessen the impact on the surface. Once construction begins there will be regular meetings with the 125 Street BID and other merchant groups.

## Second Avenue Subway Phase 2

Phase 2 of the Second Avenue Subway project will extend the Q line into East Harlem and Harlem. Phase 2 will improve and reduce commute time for area residents by creating two new stations on Second Avenue at 106 and 116 streets, as well as extending Q service to a third new station at 125 Street and Lexington Avenue that will connect to the 4/5/6 and provide access to Metro-North.
