## **Minutes**

As a quorum of the Committee was not in attendance, Acting Chair Chu postponed the approval of the TBTA portion of the minutes of the Joint-agency Committee Meeting held on February 25, 2026.

## **Committee Work Plan**

President Sheridan stated that there are no changes to the TBTA Committee Work Plan.

## **President Sheridan's Remarks**

President Sheridan stated that as Chair Lieber had noted in a recent editorial, TBTA passed the two-year mark of its targeted joint-agency enforcement operations against ghost plates, conducting its 125th joint-operation last week at the RFK Bridge. The task force has expanded, with now 20 regional law enforcement agencies with "boots on the ground" spread across the MTA service region. Since TBTA kicked off this multi-agency initiative with the Governor, Mayor, and Chair Lieber on March 12, 2024, the task force has issued 75,000 summonses, towed 7,000 vehicles, and made 1,700 arrests. Those interdicted are responsible for over \$66 million dollars owed collectively to all member agencies. President Sheridan thanked all task force members and their dedicated employees for continuing this work, which is making a difference as shown by a decrease of unbillable tolls.

## **Report on Enforcement**

Executive Vice President, Ed King, and MTA PD Assistant Chief, Keiyon Ramsey, provided a detailed report on Enforcement. Refer to the video recording of the meeting, produced by the MTA and maintained in MTA records, for the details of the presentation, Commissioner Albert's questions, and Executive Vice President King's responses.

## **Procurements**

For March 2026, Deputy Chief Procurement Officer (DCPO) David Hanley stated that there is one (1) procurement action.

## **Non-Competitive Procurements**

DCPO Hanley stated that there are no non-competitive procurements or ratifications.

## **Competitive Procurements**

DCPO Hanley stated that there is one (1) procurement action sought for Board approval, as follows:

TBTA seeks approval to award four competitively solicited personal service contracts for Miscellaneous Intelligent Transportation System—or “ITS”—and Operations Systems Consultant Design Services on an as-needed basis. The awards will be to Henningson, Durham & Richardson Architecture and Engineering; PBS Engineering; M&J Engineering; and VHB Engineering. The contracts will be used through task-based work orders in the aggregate estimated amount of \$15,000,000 over five years.

The consultants will support TBTA with design services including the integration and maintenance of the systems to promote safe and efficient operations. This includes field ITS components such as sensors, signs, cameras, and communication links, as well as updates to control systems, cybersecurity needs, and other system integrations. The contracts also provide early-stage engineering and assessments to help plan future capital projects and ensure they align with TBTA's operational and technological needs.

Acting Chair Chu deferred the approval of the procurement to the March Board meeting as a quorum of the Committee was not in attendance.

There being no further business before the Committee, the meeting was adjourned.
