## Kickoff Meeting of the 116 and 125 Street Construction Advisory Committees



The MTA and project team kicked off the Contract 2 Construction Advisory Committee (CAC) meeting for the 116 Street and 125 Street Station areas, continuing the agency's extensive outreach and public engagement efforts. CAC meetings are designed to provide the public with a forum to interact with both MTA leadership and the Community Outreach Team and to identify and discuss any issues that may arise during the construction of the Second Avenue Subway. CACs are attended by residential and merchant leaders, who have extensive reach in East Harlem and Central Harlem, enabling them to share project updates and collect input from their community and neighbors.

## Columbia Students Tour Second Avenue Subway Construction



Earlier this month, the Second Avenue Subway project team hosted students from the Construction Administration and Project Management Programs from Columbia University's School of Professional Studies, where our very own MTA Project Director, Matt Zettwoch, is an alumnus! After getting a rundown of safety guidelines and an overview of the megaproject, the students viewed the secant pile work taking place in the Lexington Ave Yard from the perimeter. The project team also showed the students the demolition sites on 120 Street and Second Avenue to discuss the methods, mitigation, and safety measures that are being used. As engineers and architecture professionals, and as our neighbors to the west, the Columbia students were engaged and excited to see Second Avenue Subway being built!
