Important Note: When you submit your application, you must have either a Class A or Class B Commercial Driver License (CDL) or a Class A or B CDL Permit valid in the State of New York with passenger endorsement and no airbrake or other disqualifying restrictions. Only candidates with the above license/permit will be canvassed and considered for the position.

If you do not have the permit/license at this time, you can file your application once you obtain the license/permit.

You must have had your valid motor vehicle driver license or CDL for at least three years prior to the date that you apply for this position.

This is a provisional position

To gain permanent status as a Bus Operator for New York City Transit, you must apply for the civil service examination, pass the competitive multiple-choice test and be appointed from the resulting list.

No minimum education or previous professional driving experience required.

Compensation:

Salary Range: The current minimum salary for Bus Operator is \$28.76 per hour for a 40-hour week increasing to \$41.09 per hour in the sixth year of service. These rates are subject to change. The benefits of this position include, but are not limited to, night and weekend salary differentials, paid holidays, vacation and sick leave, a comprehensive medical plan and a pension plan.

Responsibilities:

Bus Operators, under general supervision, safely and efficiently operate an MTA New York City Transit bus transporting passengers along an assigned route while adhering to a schedule, New York City traffic regulations, New York State law, and MTA New York City Transit rules and regulations. They ensure the proper payment of

fares; issue and collect transfers; ensure the safety of passengers; ensure the safety and security of the assigned bus; perform pre-trip and post-trip inspections; complete various reports; and perform related work.

Some of the physical activities performed by Bus Operators and environmental conditions experienced are: working outdoors in all weather conditions; communicating with customers; walking up and down stairways and ramps; avoiding hazards in depots; hearing horns, buzzers, and verbal warnings; distinguishing colored lights; seeing and anticipating traffic hazards at a distance and in all directions; making visual inspections of buses; sitting for long periods of time; operating a wheelchair lift; and climbing into and out of an Operator's seat.

Special Working Conditions: Bus Operators may be required to work various shifts, including nights, Saturdays, Sundays and holidays.

(This brief description does not include all of the duties of this position.)

License Requirement:

When you submit your application, you must possess a motor vehicle driver license valid in the State of New York for at least three years immediately prior to the date you are appointed to this position. If you have serious moving violations, license suspension or an accident record, you may be disqualified. Additionally, you must have either:

1. A Class A or Class B Commercial Driver License valid in the State of New York with a passenger endorsement and no restrictions that would preclude the performance of Bus Operator work; or
2. A Learner's Permit for a Class B Commercial Driver License valid in the State of New York with a passenger endorsement and no restrictions that would preclude the performance of Bus Operator work.

If you are appointed under "2" above, you must obtain the Class B Commercial Driver License during the training program in bus operation.

The Class A or Class B Commercial Driver License (CDL) with passenger endorsement, no airbrake restriction and no other disqualifying restrictions must be maintained for the duration of your employment in the title. This license and/or permit must not include any restrictions which would preclude the performance of Bus Operator work.

Commercial Motor Vehicle Driving Experience in the Military or New York National Guard: If you are an active member or former member (discharged in the past year) of the military or New York National Guard and have experience driving a Commercial Motor Vehicle in the military or New York National Guard, you may be eligible for a waiver of the New York State commercial driving skills test through the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV). If you believe that you may be eligible for this waiver, you must apply for the waiver through the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles.

How to Apply:

If you meet the License Requirements above, you can submit an online application by clicking the link at the end of page 3.

Reminder: **You must meet the CD license/permit requirement to apply.** If you do not possess the necessary license/permit, you may consider applying at a later date after you obtain the license/permit.

Selection Method:

Candidates who submit the online application will receive a License verification questionnaire to confirm that they possess the required CD license and/or permit.

Applicants who complete the questionnaire and meet the license requirement will receive a random list number and will be invited to begin the pre-employment process. During the pre-employment process, candidates will be asked to provide their driver's license.

Applicants must keep their contact information (email, mailing, phone) up to date. The contact information you entered in your online profile with the MTA will be used to contact you. You can update your address and other contact information by logging into your MTA profile or by sending an email to examsunit@nyct.com.

Hiring List:

The hiring list will consist of candidates who possess the Class A or B CDL or the Class A or B CDL Permit. This hiring list will be updated as candidates who possess the license or permit apply for the position.

Requirements to be Appointed:

Drug Screening Requirement: You must pass a drug screening in order to be appointed, and if appointed, you will be subject to random drug and alcohol tests for the duration of your employment. Additionally, if you have tested positive on a drug or alcohol test or had a refusal to test during pre-employment or while employed by a Federal DOT-regulated employer during the applicable period, you must have completed the Substance Abuse Professional (SAP) evaluation, referral and education/treatment process required by federal law in order to be promoted to this safety-sensitive position.

Medical Requirement: Medical guidelines have been established for the position of Bus Operator. You will be examined to determine whether you can perform the essential functions of the position. Where appropriate, reasonable accommodation will be provided for a person with a disability to enable them to perform the essential functions of the job.

Residency: New York City residency is not required for this position.

English Requirement: You must be able to understand and be understood in English to perform the duties and responsibilities of the position.

Proof of Identity: Under the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, you must be able to prove your identity and your right to obtain employment in the United States prior to employment with New York City Transit.

Additional Information:

Training: All appointees must satisfactorily complete a Bus Operator training program in accordance with New York City Transit standards. Appointees who do not satisfactorily complete the training program will be subject to being terminated.

Probationary Period: You will be required to complete a probationary period. If you do not successfully complete the probationary period, you may be terminated.
